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MB&F does not make watches. It builds horological machines, says founder Max Büsser, who teams with various independent visionaries to fulfill his futuristic timekeeping concepts. This fall, Büsser unveiled *Horological Machine No. 3 (HM3)*, the third chapter of his brand's sci-fi horological thriller. Reprising his partnership with Jean-Marc Wiederrecht and designer Eric Giroud of Agenhor, Büsser takes another flamboyant aesthetic leap with the goggle-eyed HM3. The timepiece, which will be delivered next year, comes in two variations—*Sidewinder* and *Starcruiser*—allowing you to choose the position of the two raised cones that indicate hours and minutes. Meanwhile, a large date wheel arcs around the hallmark scimitar-shaped rotor, which is on full display on the top of this inverted design. To infinity and beyond. *Price: \$74,000*

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
