

Ahead of its Time

Max Büsser's personal brand MB&F is the stuff avant-garde horology is made of, with futuristic machines that tell time in practically never-before-seen dimensions. His first of three Horological Machines set the tone of an ultra-modern collection with dual-dial form.

The HM1 features the hours, minutes and power reserve on separate dials with a centrally raised one-minute tourbillon in a case shaped like the lenses of binoculars. The watch has a manual and automatic movement that can run for a seven-day duration thanks to the four mainspring barrels. The four barrels are responsible for the shape and construction of the case, making this timepiece ahead of its time. With two barrels on either side of the movement, the watch reduces the torque of each mainspring, decreasing wear and increasing longevity while maintaining long-lasting energy.

While futuristic in form and technology, MB&F does not do away with horological tradition. The single arm tourbillon on the cock is a reference to those found on vintage Breguet pocket watches, allowing an unobstructed view into the heart of the movement.

This watch is available in red gold or white gold or black PVD-coated white gold that measures 41 mm x 64 mm. The dials are either silver, dark gray or open. Price: \$195,000
